Flooding in Midwestern U.S. Affecting Intermodal Service (May 2019)

Dear Valued Customer,

The Midwest region continues to experience unusually high amounts of rainfall, causing increased flooding and impacts to the railroad network in Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Arkansas. Nebraska and Iowa are also experiencing potential disruptions as additional track sections are put out of service around the Missouri River and the Mississippi River.

The rail companies continue to reposition crews to the affected areas and re-route trains to minimize disruption to traffic flows as much as possible. The timing for service recovery and normal transit times is closely related to the weather.
