## CBP to Require Certificates of Exportation for Imports of South Korean Steel Products Subject to Absolute Quotas

Dear Valued Customer,

Effective October 18, 2019, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will require certificates of exportation for imports of steel products from the Republic of Korea that are subject to absolute quotas. The Republic of Korea agreed to absolute quotas to avoid Section 232 tariffs on steel to the U.S. The certificates will be required at time of entry or warehouse withdrawal.

Official certificates of exportation will be issued by the Korea Iron and Steel Association, and exporters will be able to apply for them through the association's website. Federal Register Notice 84 FR 49115 announcing the new requirement can be found [here](#).
