### Comments Requested on Extending Exclusions

The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) has requested comments on the expiration of the third set of exclusions, due to expire April 18, 2020. The USTR is considering a possible extension of 1 year for certain products on that set of exclusions. The public is invited to comment on whether to extend particular exclusions.

### Another Set of Approved Exclusions Published

On Wednesday, February 5, 2020, the USTR announced another set of exclusions were approved to the September 24, 2018 Section 301 product list. In addition to the 119 exclusions granted, technical corrections have been made on prior exclusions.

The list of products, along with their HTS classification numbers, can be found in the annex to the notice [here](#). The exclusions will be retroactive to September 24, 2018 and will expire August 7, 2020.

The U.S. International Trade Commission has not yet updated the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the U.S. (HTS) and U.S. Customs and Border Protection has not yet updated the HTS database in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE). Both of those should be updated shortly.
