Typhoon Haishen Forces Port Closures In South Korea

Due to Typhoon Haishen, all major terminals in Busan and Incheon have been closed from last weekend until further notice. Currently no container movement in and out of any terminals is allowed in Korea. Domestic flights, ferry and train services were disrupted, while more than 300 flights across 10 airports, including Jeju International Airport, have been cancelled. We will continue to monitor the situation closely with our service providers and will issue further updates.
