## **Aluminum Monitoring System Effective Date set for June 2021**

Dear Valued Customer,

Beginning June 28, 2021, imports of most aluminum products will require an aluminum import license. Compliance with the new "Aluminum Import Monitoring and Analysis System" rule, known as AIM, has been delayed twice this year. The AIM effective date was originally scheduled for January 25, 2021 and was pushed out by the U.S. Commerce Department ("Commerce") until March 29, 2021. A list of aluminum products that are subject to the new rule can be found <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. Products falling under the new licensing requirements are required to obtain an import license number from Commerce for reporting on the entry summary.

The AIM system is open and available for account registration and license applications. The AIM system uses the same platform as the Steel Import Monitoring and Analysis (SIMA), so users with an existing SIMA account will not need to register for a separate AIM account. New users to either the Steel or Aluminum systems will need to register for an account prior to requesting a license.
