Australia Employees Respond to Wildfires

Stephen Bockett is a Senior Fire Fighter for the Helensburgh Volunteer Fire Brigade. The rural area, about an hour south of Sydney, is home to horse stables, apple farms and about 4,000 people who take the one road in and out of town to work every day.

Bockett takes that road to C.H. Robinson, where he works as a key account manager. Back in 2000, he joined the fire brigade to support the community and in return, has always felt support from his team at Robinson. "I have never had any issues when requesting time off to help" says Bockett.

Daryl Coleman, an operations team leader, left the company holiday party early to set up a staging area for a bushfire about a half hour north of the office in Perth. In 2005, Coleman moved from England to Australia and became a volunteer for the State Emergency Service in Western Australia. He thought it was a good way to understand the culture, make new friends and give something back to his newly adopted country.
