Brexit Transition

Dear Valued Customer,

The UK formally left the European Union on January 31, 2020 with a withdrawal agreement. Consequently, there will be a transition period that is scheduled to end on the December 31, 2020.

During the transition period, the UK's relationship with the European Union will largely remain the same. The UK will remain in Europe's customs union and single market, but will be outside the political institutions and there will be no British members in the European parliament.

The transition period will be used to negotiate a trade deal between the UK and the European Union. In the event the trade deal is not finalized by the end of 2020, the UK could leave the EU without a deal. In this case, it is possible that the transition period will be extended, but this must be done before July 1, 2020. After this date, an extension will not be possible.
