



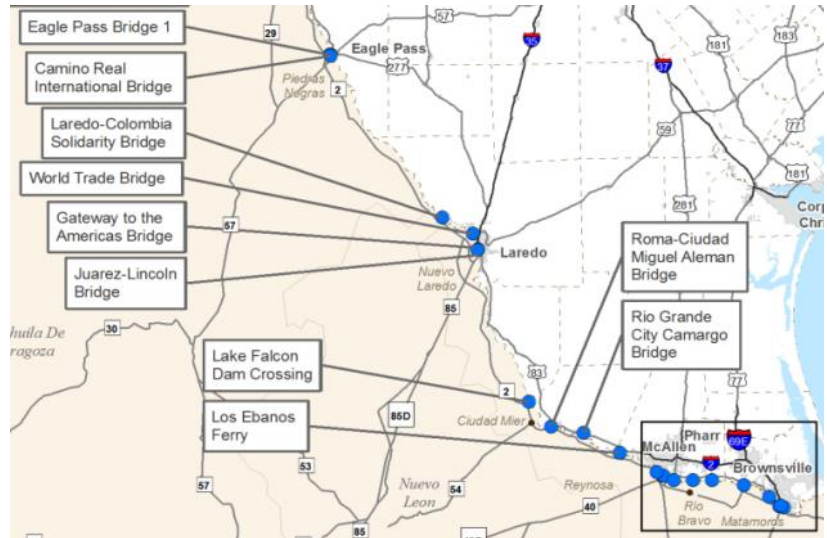
Update to Texas-Mexico Border Delays

Dear Valued Customer,

Agreements have been reached between the State of Texas and the 4 Mexican States that border Texas and share ports of entry. With the agreement between the 4 states, all Ports of Entry's (POEs) shared between Mexico and Texas are included in these agreements.

- Due to the agreements reached by the Mexican states and Texas, the DPS will reduce the thorough truck/trailer inspections that occurred earlier this week
- Freight traffic appears to be flowing slowly, but regularly across the U.S. and Mexico border
- Protest related disruption subsided reducing port congestion
- The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) discontinued thorough secondary inspections
- This will increase efficiency and reduce transit times across all of Texas's POE's
- We anticipate continued congestion through next week as the backlog is worked through.
